The education

The Danish nursing education is a general education. The education lasts for 3½ years and consists of a theoretical and a clinical part. The clinical education takes place at approved clinical placement institutions in hospitals and in the social and health care services outside hospitals.
The nursing programme corresponds to 210 ECTS of which 90 ECTS cover clinical part. **Vanessa**

Nursing education is based on academic disciplines within nursing science, medical science, science, humanities and social science.
The planning of the clinical part of the education is made by the individual schools of nursing.
The nursing programme is completed with a bachelor's project.
Please note that it is imperative that you speak and write Danish as the education is conducted in Danish. **Sally**

Clinical practise

The nursing education programme has both a theoretical and a practical part.
The programme is divided into 14 modules where the theoretical part links theory with clinical practice providing a dynamic balance between theory and clinical practice.
Nursing education is based on the latest knowledge and research results. Throughout the programme the subject of nursing is the connecting thread.
The nursing education is a full time study with approximately 15-25 lessons per week during the theoretical part and no more than 37 hours during the clinical practice periods. **Eva**

Theory

As a nurse you will need knowledge about related professions.
Nursing education is based on academic disciplines in health with nursing science, health science, natural science, humanities and social science.
During the education you are required to hand in a number of written assignments.
In the subject of nursing you will learn how to observe symptoms and situations, use your professional skills to evaluate your observations, plan the course of nursing, and perform and argue for (rationalize) your actions. **May**

You will deal with basic nursing care such as feeding, measuring of the pulse and blood pressure, giving injections, bed bathing, skin and oral care. You will also work with communication and nursing theories, ethics and topics related to value judgments. During the entire nursing education the focus will be on care to people of all ages and in all kinds of life situations.
In order to fulfil your professional and personal skills as a nurse, you will also deal with topics in management, research, information technology, prevention, and quality. **Denise**

POLICE OFFICER

Education

Every police officer in Denmark and in the Faroe Islands has attended the National Police College, which is situated on the outskirts of Copenhagen. There is also a Police College in Greenland with the same admission requirements and training programmes as Denmark.

If you want to become a police officer in Denmark, you have to meet a number of admission requirements. [vanessa](#)

You may apply if you

- are at least 21 years of age
- are a Danish national or have applied for Danish nationality/citizenship (employment as a police officer requires Danish nationality/citizenship)
- are in good health with normal hearing, eyesight and are not colourblind
- have a driving license for a car
- have an upper secondary school education (stx, hhx, htx, eux or hf) OR
- have a basic vocational education along with three additional supplementary subjects at a higher preparatory examination level – Danish/A-level, English/B-level and social studies/C-level OR
- have qualifications which may be comparable with the above mentioned ones [Eva](#)

Furthermore, importance will be attached to whether you

- are reasonably tall, are physically/mentally robust and fit for the job as a police officer
- have normal eyesight or eyesight that can be corrected by means of soft contact lenses
- have no criminal record
- live under orderly personal and financial conditions
- have good school qualifications, have knowledge of IT
- have knowledge of foreign languages [Denise](#)

Admission test

If you fulfill the requirements there is an admission test consisting of several elements:

- a written part where your skills in Danish (grammar/expression in writing) and English will be tested.
- a physical test where agility, physical strength, staying power, coordination and running will be tested.
- a team assignment where your co-operative skills will be tested
- a final interview in which your overall performance, along with your application and your personality will be assessed and compared with our general profile of a qualified police officer who is able to complete the training. [May](#)

Training

The training takes approximately three years.

At the National Police College, police officers learn about police theory, the Road Traffic Act , criminal law, physical training, various legislation, first aid, radio communication, service abroad, identification of drugs, securing evidence, crime prevention, cultural sociology, management, human rights, psychology and educational theory - to mention just a few.

After three years' training as a police probationer, you will join the permanent staff as a police constable. Sally

Bachelor of social education

Admission requirements

Admission to the Bachelor of Education programme is available to people who have completed one of

the following education programmes or subjects:

- An upper secondary education
- A social and healthcare training programme, including C-level Danish and science and D-level English
- The basic educational training programme, including C-level Danish and social science and E-level English
- Four individual subjects at the upper secondary level: A-level Danish, B-level English, C-level social science as well as an elective subject at a C-level. **Denise**

The aim of the programme

The programme is to provide professional qualifications for working with development and care assignments within the following areas: children and young people (including working in day nurseries, day-care centres, pre-school classes, recreation centres/school-based leisure time facilities, after school clubs, 24-hour service institutions), institutions for children, young people and adults with reduced psychological or physical capacities, adults with social problems (home-lessness, substance abuse, mental disorders), family institutions, and child and youth psychiatric hospitals **Eva**

Additionally, the education provides qualifications for working in the field of crime prevention in, for example, neighbourhoods as well as working within the Prison and Probation Service

The programme provides students with the foundation for further education and training, for example in a range of educational diploma programmes within, for example, psychology, educational work, social psychiatry, social work, special needs and youth education **Sally**

Lenght, structure and content

The programme lasts 3½ years, amounting to 210 ECTS credits, and consists of formal teaching at the educational institution as well as practical training at relevant institutions. There are three periods of practical training during the programme. The total amount of time of the education programme spent on practical training amounts to 1 year and 3 months. **May**

The programme of education consists of the following subjects and academic elements:

- Educational theory and practice
- Danish, culture and communication
- Individual, institution and society
- One of the following main subjects according the student's own choice:
 - a) Health, the body and exercise
 - b) Expression, music and drama
 - c) Arts and crafts, science and technology
- Practical training
- Specialisation within one of the following occupational or functional fields:
 - a) Children and young people
 - b) People with reduced functionality
 - c) People with social problems

At the conclusion of the education programme each student must complete a bachelor project **Vanessa**
